Welcome to our monthly newsletter! We are thrilled to share with you the latest developments in our mission to make a positive impact in our community.

Firstly, we would like to express our gratitude to all of our dedicated community partners and volunteers who have continued to support us! Your generosity and dedication have allowed us to keep our programs running smoothly and effectively.

There are many people in our communities who don't really know what we do at Horizon Health. We're hoping that this newsletter and our community outreach changes that. We provide mental and behavioral health treatment including treatment for addiction, serving clients 6 years and older. We offer individual counseling, group counseling, MAT services as a recovery tool, and intensive outpatient services.

Additionally, as a means to treat the person holistically, we provide several support services such as targeted case management, transportation to and from appointments, peer support specialists, a state-certified childcare, ADHD testing, family support, employment services, an on-site lab, and community health workers. We also offer a variety of training including harm prevention, opioid overdose response, employment workshops, and more!

Finally, we want to extend a huge thank you to the community partnerships and support we have received at all three locations.

Together, we can make a real difference in the lives of those who need it most. It takes collaboration, not competition. We can't wait to work with each of you in the future.

Exciting news! Horizon will open a campus in Knox County! This facility will host a designated training center for community members to engage in a variety of new and exciting courses, expanding their knowledge and skillset.

The campus is set to open fall 2024 and will offer outpatient services for behavioral health and addiction treatment, a statecertified childcare center, transportation, family services, targeted case management, and so much more.

Additionally, Horizon will offer an Intensive Outpatient Program (IOP), at all three campuses. IOP is offered to those individuals that are looking for a more intensive specialized treatment.

Clients can attend tele-health or in office. Intensive and intentional; this group meets for 3 hour sessions on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays.

Our IOP program meets DOC requirements for individuals on probation and parole.

Stories of Impact

Miranda began her addiction on the day of her 23rd birthday. Through the years, as it often does, her addiction progressively worsened, especially after the tragic loss of her mother to cancer

Miranda had tried for years to stay sober, bouncing in and out of treatment after treatment, including her fair share of inpatient programs and rehab centers. Eventually, she walked into Horizon Health's Williamsburg Campus. It was on her first visit with us, she learned she was pregnant with her now 6-month-old son. The tears shed that day were both happy and sad. She knew then she needed to change her behavior for the good of her unborn child, but still was struggling with substance use.

At each appointment, one of our Peer Support Specialists, Carla, would try to persuade Miranda to join the housing program. Finally, much to our surprise, she agreed. Three months into the residential program Miranda left to go live with her sister. Despite our best efforts to implore her to stay, Miranda said it was time for her to leave. Less than a week later, Miranda had relapsed.

Thankfully, Miranda fought through the haze of substance use and called Tameka, another Peer Support Specialist. Miranda agreed to go to detox and return to the program starting over at day one. Tameka was able to get her readmitted the same day and our specialist went to pick her up for treatment.

Miranda completed five months of the residential treatment and continued intensive outpatient treatment and regular counseling after leaving campus. July 29th will make a year clean and sober for Miranda. Miranda use medically assisted treatment as a recovery tool and proudly she is now 3 months off on suboxone.
